The GreenGenerations Multiplier Event in Cyprus

Nicosia, 12 February 2025

SYNTHESIS Center for Research and Education successfully organized the national multiplier event of the *GreenGenerations* project in Cyprus, hosted at **Platy Anglantzias School in Nicosia**. The event took place during the national week dedicated to "The Educator," an initiative where schools across Cyprus offer trainings, workshops, and presentations to empower educators with new skills and current educational approaches.

The *GreenGenerations* event brought together **44 participants**, including teachers from primary and secondary schools, school leaders, local community representatives, and education stakeholders. The aim was to introduce participants to the project's vision for tackling climate change through intergenerational learning and to showcase its key results.

The event began with warm welcomes from the Headmistress and Vice Headmistress of the hosting school, followed by a presentation from Georgia Karaoli (SYNTHESIS), who provided an overview of the project's objectives, methodology, and European partnership. She highlighted the importance of intergenerational collaboration as a strategic tool for fostering sustainability in schools and communities.

Participants were introduced to the **GreenGenerations teacher training package and curriculum**, both of which aim to equip educators with practical tools for integrating sustainability and climate education into classroom settings. The curriculum includes interactive activities that encourage cooperation between students and adults, such as co-designing sustainable projects and reflecting on real-world environmental challenges.

The event also featured the presentation of the **GreenGenerations digital platfor**, a central resource hub that allows educators to access materials, collaborate with other schools, and engage with their local communities in promoting eco-conscious living.

A key element of the day was the exchange of good practices and hands-on experiences in sustainability education. Educators shared their ideas on involving parents and grandparents in school-based sustainability initiatives, recognizing the power of intergenerational approaches to enhance student engagement and environmental awareness.

The event concluded with interactive discussions, networking, and evaluation. Participants expressed their enthusiasm and appreciation for the resources and strategies presented, noting that the event deepened their understanding of how education can address climate challenges through collective and cross-generational action.
