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4TH TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING

Thessaloniki, Greece



On the 6th and 7th June the 4th Transnational Project Meeting (TPM) of GreenGenerations project took place in Thessaloniki, Greece. The host organization, Stimmuli for Social Change, provided great hospitality to all partners, including holding the meeting at its premises, located at the city center.

Partners had the opportunity to discuss both administrative and implementation tasks, starting from the dissemination of the Teachers' Training Package (WP2). Then, partners worked together to reflect, exchange feedback and finalize the lesson plans that will comprise the GreenGenerations Curriculum (WP3), a set of innovative, experiential and intergenerational-led educational resources for teachers and students.

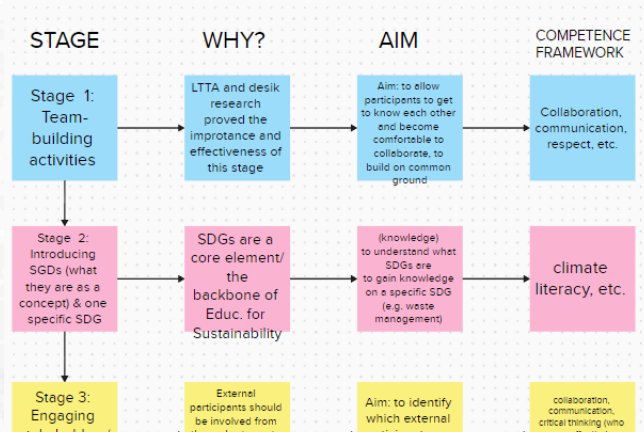
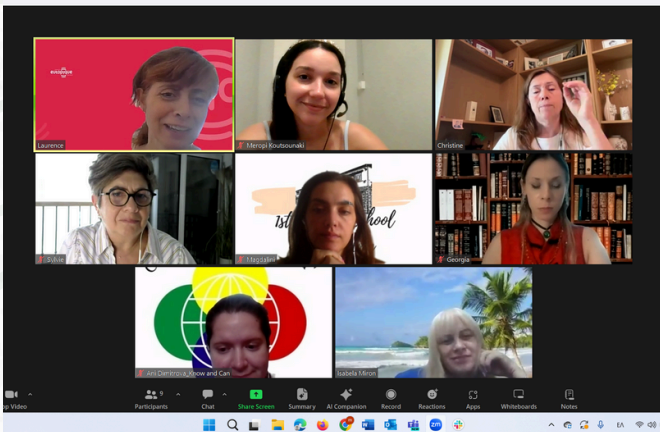
In addition, partners elaborated on the content to be integrated in the GreenGenerations Platform (WP4), while exploring further exploitation opportunities with schools, parents and community members. Finally, the optimization and reinforcement of the dissemination activities were at the forefront of the TPM implementation activities.



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Take a look into the GG Curriculum



The GG Curriculum aims to support primary and secondary education teachers to implement the GG methodology in a class by proposing activities for students towards a greener changemaking attitude employing intergenerational learning for climate change advocacy and action.

The curriculum includes a set of innovative lesson plans and educational resources based on intergenerational learning and participatory, action-oriented approaches (i.e. inquiry-based learning, design thinking, environmental activism, etc.). The intergenerational approach of the GG methodology is reflected on the transversal application of the activities at three levels: *at school, at home and in the community*.

An important element of the GG Curriculum is that the activities are adaptable to different educational contexts and age groups, allowing in this way its implementation in various contexts, involving students with different profiles, backgrounds, and educational needs.

What's next?

Partners are already preparing for the pilot phase of the GG Curriculum. During this phase, partner schools (Centrul Judetean de Excelenta-CJE, 1st Primary School of Alexandria-PSA) will engage teachers, students, parents, and external stakeholders (e.g., activists, community members, NGOs) in the real-life implementation of the GG educational resources.
